

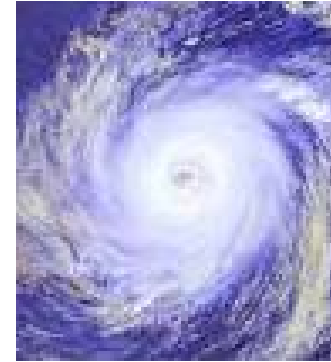

"For official information before, during and after a storm, listen to Pinellas County radio station WEOC-AM940."

"If you have a PUBLIC ALERT radio or NOAA radio, Tuned to Channel 7 for the latest reports".

"Grab-N-Go Package"

When evacuating Briar Creek to a County shelter, Each residence should carry with them a "Grab-N-Go" package. It is recommended that the following items should be contained:

1. Medications (possible 2-weeks supply)
2. Identification
3. Toiletries
4. Battery Operated Radio (with extra batteries)
5. Flashlight (with extra batteries)
6. First Aid Kit
7. Important Papers *
8. Snack Foods
9. Cards or Game book to past time
10. Something to sleep on & cover
11. List of Relatives and/or Friends phone numbers
12. Pet Supplies and Cage/Carrier
13. Cash (small denominations)

"If Evacuating to a Mends or relatives home, all of the above would not be necessary".

Remember, If you have Special Needs or have a Pet, Pre-registration is a requirement Don't Delay If this Is the case. You may have difficulties getting into one of these shelters If you wait until the last minute.

*Important papers should include a copy of all your bills so you have your account numbers and insurance information

"HOME SITE PRECAUTIONS FOR EVACUATION"

1. Main Water Valve should be shut off
2. Main Circuit Breaker should be turned off
3. Lawn Furniture should be secured or placed inside
4. Trash Cans should be placed in shed
5. Hanging/potted plants should be placed inside
6. Windows and Doors should be locked
7. Secure all Awnings

"If you have an opportunity, notify your Emergency Contact about your evacuation plans".

"Remember, flying debris, either yours or someone elses, can cause severe damage. Minimize that damage by following the steps above".

"As a friendly reminder, photos should be taken of everything Inside and outside of your home. Keep them with your important papers that will be contained within your Grab-N-Go package".

If you need help in planning the above, contact one of Your "Emergency Planning & Response" team members.

"STORM SURVIVAL KIT"

Below is a *Check-list* of suggested goods to have in your possession for after the storm. This would be in the event that adequate supplies and services are not available:

Be sure of your evacuation zone
Containers for drinking water - 5 gallons per person (Min)
Seal Water containers tightly & store in cool dark place
Containers for sewerage: (2)-5 gallons buckets with covers
Heavy Duty Trash Bags
Bleach (pure, unscented, liquid)
Water Purification Tablets
Non-Perishable Food & Beverage (3-Day Supply)
Pet Carrier, Extra Pet Food, water, Litter and other supplies
Non-Electric Can Opener
Emergency camping/cooking equipment and fuel
Fire Extinguisher
Portable Cooler
Matches or Lighters
Rope, Duct Tape, Tarp
Baby Food/Formula, Diapers & Wipes
Extra Prescription Medication (2-weeks supply)
Battery Powered Radio and extra batteries
2-Flashlights and extra batteries
List of important phone numbers
insurance Policies/Titles
Toiletries
Special Dietary Needs
Insect Repellent
First Aid Kit
Cash (smaller denominations)

County Shelters

There are Three (3) shelters available in our immediate area.

1. **McMullen Booth Elementary** 669-1800
3025 Union Street, Clearwater
 Leave the park take a left on McMullen Booth go south (2 Miles) to light at Union Street.
 Turn right and school is on the Left (.1 Miles).
Total Distance Is 2.1 Miles

2. **Safety Harbor Middle School** 724-1400
125 7th Street North, Safety Harbor
 Leave park go left on McMullen Booth to RT 580. Turn Left on RT 580 go to Phillippe Parkway (.9 Miles) Turn right on Philippe for 2.4 Miles. Turn right on Bailey Street (.1 Miles) Turn left @ stop sign and go approx. 100' to next stop sign on left. **Total Distance Is 4 Miles**

3. **Dunedin Middle School** 469-4112 *Patricia Avenue, Dunedin*
 ***** This is a Special Need Shelter *****
 Leave park go left on McMullen Booth to RT 580. Turn Right on RT 580 going west. Stay on 580 into Dunedin to Patricia Avenue (4.1 Miles) Turn left on Patricia and go 1.3 Miles to school on right

Note; None of these shelters accommodate pets. You should leave early because these shelters will fill up fast. Explore boarding arrangements for your pets in advance of any evacuation to save time if you have to get out fast.

Preparing for you Pet's Safety

Do's

1. Plan for your pet well in advance if you live in an evacuation area.
2. Take your pet with you when you evacuate. Know your evacuation route.
3. Ask friends or family living outside of evacuation areas if they can keep your pet.
4. Make sure your pet has proper identification with either a collar tag or a microchip implant. Remember: A license is your pet's ticket home.
5. Make sure you have a collar and leash for keeping your pet under control.
6. Keep a pet carrier for each pet - one that allows your pet to stand and turn around. The carrier should be marked with your pet's identification.
7. Make sure all of your pet's vaccinations are current have proof available.
8. Pack supplies for your pet including current veterinary records, several days' worth of food and water, medications with instructions, bowls, favorite toy and blanket, cat litter/pan, plastic bags, collar/leash and a current photo of you with your pet.
9. If you must use a kennel make sure it is not in an evacuation zone, and reserve space as soon as possible, kennels require proof of vaccinations.

REMEMBER-

"There are more than 100 times more pets than boarding kennel spaces in Pinellas County."

"Check for pet-friendly hotels and motels during an evacuation by calling (727) 464-7200, the St. Petersburg/Clearwater Area Convention & Visitors Bureau or review "AAA - Traveling With Your Pet".

Evacuation Routes

Depending upon the direction of the impending storm, the following routes are suggested as a means of escaping:

Storm from the North so you travel South

1. Travel South on Route 19
2. Travel South on Alternate 19
3. Go South on McMullen Booth Rd to 49th Street to I-275

Storm from the South so you travel North

1. Travel North on Route 19
2. Travel North on Alternate 19
3. Go North on McMullen Booth Rd to East Lake Rd to Route 54 to I-75

Storm from the West so you travel East

1. Travel South on McMullen Booth to Courtney Campbell
2. Travel East on 580 to Hillsborough to I-4
3. Travel East on 580 to Linebaugh
4. Travel East on 580 to Racetrack Rd to Gunn Hwy to Route 54

The direction you choose and how far you will go depends on the nature of the threat and the direction the threat is coming from.

A Florida State Map should be in your vehicle at all times and the evacuation routes should be highlighted.

"ABOVE ALL, DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE"

"THE PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED ROUTES WILL BE VERY CONGESTED AS THE STORM APPROACHES".
